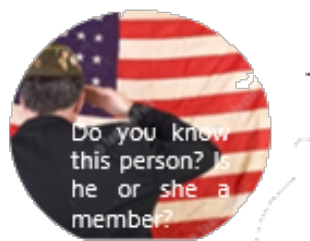

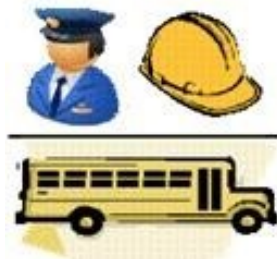
Rudolph the red nosed reindeer was created 80 years ago by a Montgomery Ward adman. The store gave away 2.6 million books to children in Christmas 1939.

VA PreNeed Eligibility

Here is the info to apply for VA Burial before a Veteran dies. If you plan to be buried at one of the State of Minnesota Veteran cemeteries, this form is not for them it is only for the VA cemetery. At the state cemetery, the Veteran is buried free of charge but to bury your wife is not free it cost \$500. At VA cemeteries you and your spouse are buried free.

Tricare for Life Prescriptions

Military retirees until February 2018 received their prescriptions through the mail at no cost at all as Military Retirees had been promised when they put in their 20 or more years of duty. In February of that year suddenly without notice the program now cost a \$7.00 co-pay for each 90 day supply of generic drug sent through the mail. The Retirees found out that the DIC offset (also known as the widow's offset) was overturned in congress but they forgot to fund it. The funding comes from the newly implemented co-pay for prescriptions by the Military Retirees. Just as the Retirees are trying to adjust to this unseen take away of their earned benefits, as of January 1, 2020, they will be getting another surprise. There will be an additional 40 per cent increase in their generic co-pays, bringing the co-pay cost from \$7.00 to \$10.00 for each generic prescription. And even more for brand names. As your Post Service Officer I recommend that you check out prices at Walmart Pharmacy, Cub pharmacy and Costco pharmacy (be sure to ask for the price of a 90 day supply). I think taking from one program to fund another is bad and another case of the government backing down from what they promised our Retirees for staying on duty for 20 or more years. This slow erosion of promised benefits has got to stop.

Legislation

Greetings Palmer Lake Comrades, Friends, & Family,

Welcome to December! Despite the fact 'Winter is coming', we have a positive effort on the legislative front started by Minnesota's Senator Tina Smith. Just before Veteran's Day, she introduced the Veterans Hearing Benefits Act of 2019:

The legislation aims to make a diagnosis of hearing loss and/or tinnitus a presumptive of active duty service for Veterans who served in military occupational specialties that were likely exposed to a sufficiently high level of acoustic trauma or who served in combat.

This Act would be a win/win. Not only would it benefit the Veteran, but it will also benefit the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) as well as the Veteran Service Officers (VSO) who advocate to the VA on behalf of Veterans. Hearing loss and tinnitus constitute the number one claimed disability; making it presumptive will massively reduce the work hours dedicated to adjudicating, and appealing the claims which in turn would get benefits to Veterans faster.

As a VSO, I have represented several Veterans on appeals in front of VA Law Judges. I don't have the exact stats in front of me, but anecdotally, at least half of those appeals (likely more), were for hearing loss and/or tinnitus. All Veterans filed their claims years before appearing in front of a judge; it had been so long for many that they did not even know their appeals were still ongoing! Further, most Veterans needed to pay out of pocket to a private provider for a medical opinion that linked hearing loss or tinnitus to their service in order to win the appeal.

Veterans should not need to wait years or spend money to be service connected for hearing loss or tinnitus – passing the Veterans Hearing Benefits Act of 2019 would help make that a reality. Let's support it.

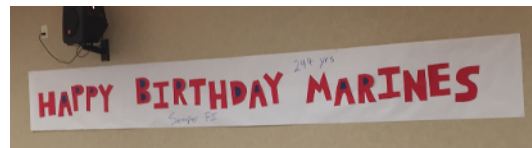
